



### **UNDER LOCK & SKELETON KEY - GIGI PANDIAN 3.15.22**




- First in new cozy mystery series involving magic, Indian food, houses with secret passages, and a charming heroine.

- Breezy, whip-smart, crowd-pleasing, and surprising debut novel


### KAIJU PRESERVATION SOCIETY - JOHN SCALZI 3.15.22

- Breezy sciency fun. Light tone, warm characters; like a pop song.





- Plenty of twists and turns. Perfect bedtime read.


