

JOHNSON COUNTY LIBRARY FOUNDATION

The Johnson County Library Foundation's mission is to build an endowment for the Library's collection and secure support for lifelong learning programs offered at Johnson County Library. We do this by securing and managing donations from individuals, businesses, and foundations to support the Library above and beyond what public funding provides.

In 2022, the Johnson County Library Foundation provided \$226,889 of support to the Library

- **Collection Support** **\$126,194**
 - Invested funds disbursement to enhance collection materials
- **Race Project** **\$28,433**
(Kauffman Foundation, various individuals)
 - 20 local high schools participated in 2021-2022 School Year
 - 158 students participated in the first of three virtual workshops with student Diversity Ambassadors from UMKC
 - A digital publication was produced in October 2022 and featured writing and recipes from the 2021-2022 student cohorts

 - Partnership with Johnson County MED-ACT for 3D Printed medical training devices
 - 3,254 Equipment tutorials viewed

- **Immigrant Services** **\$8,390**
(Kauffman Foundation)
 - 220 children and families attended weekend festivities in summer 2022 and received books and CDs

 - 922 submissions for the 2022 publication
 - 115 published pieces
 - 62 attended virtual reception and program and 12 teens read their work
- **Adult Incarcerated Programs** **\$4,608**

 - 136 clients signed up for Johnson County Library cards
 - 691 books were checked out from the Johnson County Library
 - 787 books were checked out from the Adult Residential Center Library collection on campus
- **Genealogy** **\$4,704**

 - 835 people attended monthly programs (virtually and in person)
 - 114 people attended the day-long annual seminar
 - New Memory Lab equipment will enable the public to digitize their family photos and other documents

- **Writers' Conference** **\$4,242**
(Berkley Writers Fund)
 - 1,141 in attendance, 44 in person sessions over 3-day event
 - 518 in attendance for 17 virtual sessions
